

### **Autumn term 2015**

Our discussion centred around homework again. It was decided to review current practice and review the policy if necessary. This would then be shared with parents at the next consultation evenings.

### **Spring term 2016**

The meeting centred around consistency of homework across the school. This was referred back to staff and the matter was resolved quickly. It was agreed that there would be maths and English weekly, with additional pieces at the teacher's discretion.

### **Summer term 2016**

This meeting discussed:

- the curriculum
- reporting progress and attainment to parents
- the new spelling programme in KS2
- school lunches
- attendance

Curriculum developments were explained. Whilst ensuring high standards in English and maths, the school is committed to developing all aspects of the child and is currently focussing on the local curriculum, which includes taking learning outdoors, an art project and Heritage Schools.

The parents discussed the sharing of targets and would like to have more regular reporting from school. It was agreed that school would explore the possibility of having shorter, termly reports, rather than the longer, summer annual report.

The new spelling programme was clarified and it was agreed to communicate this to parents through a newsletter and on the school website.

The issue of school lunches and there being less choice for children at the end of the queue was discussed. This will be raised with the school cook, although school has introduced a band system to ensure that children keep to their original choices.

Parents were informed that school will be having a focus on attendance this term and will recognise weekly 100% attendance with the popular 'postcards home.' Attendance is a national issue and all schools have to show that they are doing their best to encourage all families to support their child/ren's attendance.
