## Targeted academic support for current academic year

Measure	Activity
Priority 1	Target interventions properly and monitor rigorously. The focus on phonics and reading will have targeted resources.
Priority 2	Ensure phonically decodable books and targeted teaching are used in year 2 so that children reach year 3 ready to read challenging texts and to apply this to their own writing.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Financial limitations and staff training
Projected spending	£10000

## Wider strategies for current academic year

Measure	Activity
Priority 1	Focus on learning behaviour in KS1 through emotion coaching, matching teaching to pupils' needs and engaging with the wider school community to encourage and motivate pupils.
Priority 2	Support pupils in KS2 at risk of falling behind or who are experiencing difficulties which could place them at risk of falling behind.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Staff expertise, adequate supervision of pastoral support and enough time to target need effectively.

<p>Increased progress in reading from end of KS1 to the end of KS2.</p> <p>Increased progress in writing from end of KS1 to end of KS2</p>	<p>Writing improved significantly. Reading was disappointing, although children had made improvements in their fluency.</p>
<p>Learning behaviours will improve and pupils will be given strategies and support to deal with social and emotional difficulties.</p>	<p>There has been an improvement in KS2 with fewer incidents and fewer referrals to Early Help. The pastoral intervention from the ATA has had significant impact with a number of pupils.</p>
