Attendance.

As a result of the pandemic, children have missed significant amounts of learning and all schools are working extremely hard to ensure that this does not impact upon them too much. At Leyburn, we 'block plan' a number of school subjects, such as RE, history, geography and art so, if you child is absent, they will have missed a significant amount of the teaching and learning for that subject. Whilst we appreciate that families are also managing a range of issues, we have had a lot of requests for holidays during term-time which we are not authorising and which could incur a penalty notice.

We expect whole school and individual attendance to be **at least** 95%.

Attendance of 90% means that a month of school has been missed.

When a child has attendance of below 90%, this is considered to be 'persistent absenteeism' and we will contact you to let you know and to see if there is anything we can do to help.
