
Year: 5 Term: Spring 1 2025

English: We are focusing our learning on the Americas and using the text of Holes by Louis Sachar, which is based in Texas. Our writing will be using speech and dialogue for characterisation and we will be debating some of the actions of the characters in oracy sessions. RE: 'What would Jesus do?' is our new theme where we will consider if and how the teachings of the Bible can be applied to modern-day life.


As part of this, we are hoping to visit the awe-inspiring Durham Cathedral for a guided tour and workshop where we will look at real historical artefacts to piece

Science: Last term we looked at the force of gravity on Earth and we will build on this in a unit of contact and non-contact forces. We will investigate air and water resistance as well as electro-magnetic forces (in a science workshop at Richmond School) and how friction can sometimes be a useful force and sometimes cause us problems in our everyday lives.

Geography: Last term, we learned about journeys such as Shackleton's and those into space. This term, we are looking at the Americas, specifically the USA and how it is so physically, socially and



economically diverse.

We will be developing our teamwork and ball skills in netball on a Wednesday. On

We will discuss terms associated with discrimination, explore scenarios where this can occur and what we can do to respond to it or prevent it happening. We will then be moving on to our 'living in the wider world topic', learning all about the world of work and challenging stereotypes.

Carbon Schools. We will sequence blocks, add text and speech and combine movement to make it informative but exciting!
