Term: Spring 2 2025



Termly overview: Another 6-week half-term is upon us and we turn our attention to a little more outdoor work that we've had in recent months. Again, please ensure children have wellies in school each day to allow outdoor play and learning whatever the weather gives us. English: We are continuing learning on the Americas and using the text of 50 States which is jam-packed


DT: This term's unit will look at cams and the movement created by different shapes. We will be using saws and glue guns to create a sturdy frame structure then adding a cam mechanism to make a moving toy. An old shoe box would be very helpful if you have any.

RE: We will be starting to think about Easter with our unit of 'What does Jesus' death and Resurrection mean to Christians?' We'll look at how Christians prepare for Easter and the meaning of Lent. We'll also discuss repentance and how the Jewish festival of Pesach fits with the story of Easter?



Science: Life cycles is our new area of learning where we will describe the differences

in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect



and a bird. We'll also learn about the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.

History: Using our local area, we are beginning a longer history unit about changes in Leyburn with a focus on the Victorian period. We will be exploring the wider national change brought about by the Industrial Revolution as well as how this may have impacted on our town. We will use sources such as census data, maps and photographs to explore what life was like for people living here. Any personal connections you could bring to our learning
