


Leyburn Primary School curriculum newsletter

English: We begin by working on our oracy skills and vocabulary by writing and performing our own poems based on 'The Magic Box'. Our next unit is based on the legend of 'Beowulf'. We will be performing speeches in role as the hero and writing

our own stories based on the myth.



Storytime / RfP: We have organised for us to visit The Old School House to watch the endearing tale of 'The Wild Robot' this half-term. Therefore, our class text is focused on reading the book before

we watch the adaptation.

will investigate how to make simple circuits with wires, bulbs, cells and buzzers by making our own. We will learn the scientific symbols and investigate how to make bulbs brighter before applying our learning to our DT work.




Maths: We will be working on the remaining times-tables this half-term, particularly focusing on the 6x, 7x and 9x

tables. This will then enable us to tackle trickier multiplication and division questions during our maths lessons. In addition, we will be revising the multiplication and division facts linked to some of the 'easier' tables so that all children become completely fluent in them.



DT: We will be using our science work to investigate how

PSHE: We will be learning

Music: Our inspiration for this half-term's music is the rodeo-themed classical tune, 'Hoedown', by the American composer Aaron Copland.

We will be responding to the music through dance before going on to develop our own compositions based on it.



History: We will be learning about the lives of Vikings and how they were similar or different to the Anglo-

Saxons. We will look at where they came from, why they settled in Britain and how they influenced our lives today.
