
Year: 5 Term: Autumn 2 2025

Antarctica. We will be taking on roles of the crew and using lots of spoken language before writing a recount of our experiences onboard Endurance. We will be continuing our focus on transcription with regular handwriting and spelling practice.


Storytime / RfP: We are well into our class read of

Maths: We will be finishing off our work on factors, multiples, square, cube and prime numbers before heading onto a unit of fractions which will take us up until at least Christmas. We will be recognising equivalent fractions, comparing, converting and

calculating with them. It is **extremely** helpful for the students if they know their times tables




really well – once they can recall them quickly, fractions are literally, a piece of cake!

Science: We will be finding out what our solar system is like with a focus on the Earth, sun and moon.



RE: We will be finishing off our unit on Islam, talking about Hajj and why people of different faiths complete such journeys.

Then we will begin our focus on Christmas, discussing the journey of Mary and Joseph and reflect on its true meaning to Christians. Computing: This half-term will be an arty one with an exploration into
